Thanks to generous support from people like you, thousands of CNE memories have already been saved through the CNE Foundation's CNE Archives Project. However, it's a race against time. Priceless archival photographic negatives from the CNE's Alexandra Studio collection remain at risk of being lost. Your gift today ensures these shared memories are preserved for future generations.

Since 2021, public support has been essential to the *CNE Archives Project*, funding the digitization and preservation of at-risk photographs from the Alexandra Studio collection. Your generosity brings us closer to our goal of raising the final \$75,000 to complete Phase 1 of this project.

The Alexandra Studio collection - the largest in the CNE's archives - offers a visual record of the iconic CNE from 1947 to 1983, captured by this well-known Toronto-based studio operating during that period. This collection comprises 109,032 photo negatives, but many are deteriorating due to Vinegar Syndrome, a condition that threatens to erase these memories permanently.

Your support will help save these culturally and historically significant Canadian images, allowing the CNE's legacy to live on for all.

Together, we can protect the CNE's Alexandra Studio collection from the damaging effects of Vinegar Syndrome. This is a chemical reaction that deteriorates cellulose acetate photo negatives – a type of film used from the 1950s to the early 1990s – over time. Eventually, the film shrinks and cracks, leading to the loss of the images." The entirety of your gift is directed to this urgent digitization and preservation effort while also supporting young, emerging archival professionals through valuable employment opportunities.
